Q: I have an awkwardly shaped window which I am struggling to find a blinds solution for, what options are available?

A: The type of blinds that will be suitable for your window depends very much on the exact design, layout, geometry and angles involved. We always ask clients to send us photographs and approximate dimensions so we can advise on the best solution and the costs involved. In brief, for a triangular window, the options usually cover Venetian blinds, pleated blinds, vertical blinds, Pinoleum blinds, plantation shutters, and, in some cases, roller blinds.

The majority of our blinds are made, mostly by hand, in specialist factories in Wimbledon and Kent – the pleated blinds are particularly tricky to make, but have the advantage that they are fully retractable.

The most popular type mounts on the sloping side of the window and rotates closed like a fan, perfect where the blinds are to be discreet as possible as they require no support wires (whereas a blind pulling upwards would).

We can also cater to arched, circular, curved, and sloping windows, as well as skylights and very large areas of glass – with options including blackout solutions, custom powdercoating and electric operation, available for integration with home automation systems.
